Successfully challenging the Competition Commission for MyFerryLink

In a landmark victory that dealt with some fundamental issues of competition law, RPC led MyFerryLink, which operates ferries on the cross-Channel Dover-Calais route, to a crucial Competition Appeal Tribunal (CAT) case.

The competition investigation stemmed from Eurotunnel's purchase of three ferries from the insolvent SeaFrance for €65m in the summer of 2012. In October 2012, the French competition authorities cleared the acquisition of the ships, but the transaction was referred to the Competition Commission by the Office of Fair Trading in the UK.

In June 2013, the Competition Commission (CC) ruled that it was planning to prohibit MyFerryLink from operating ferry services to and from the port of Dover, but Smith's team was instrumental in convincing the CAT to thwart those plans as it was not clear that the CC had jurisdiction to review the transaction in the first place. The ruling late last year was not only crucial to the client's business, but also saved more than 600 jobs in the process. Appeals of merger decisions to the CAT are assessed to the judicial review standard so it is extremely rare that CC merger decisions are quashed in this way.
